### Water and milk only policies in Croydon schools

As a local authority, Croydon Council strongly encourages and support schools to implement water and milk only policies in school. This is to increase water consumption across the day, reduce any sugars consumed through other drinks and to have a fair and consistent approach across the school, so that all pupils have access to the same drinks.

Most juice drinks, such as Ribena, Rubicon, fruit shoot or Capri Sun, have sugars or sweeteners and also additional colourings. We know that these are not recommended for children as regular drinks. Even pure fruit juices, such as apple juice, orange juice, mango juice, have high levels of natural sugar and acid, which can damage children's teeth. We understand that families may choose these drinks at home of course, but in schools, we want to keep sugars as low as possible.

It is also important that school drinks policies are fair for all pupils. Pupils having a school meal can only drink water or milk at lunchtime, therefore it is only fair to ask the same of packed lunch children. This means that all children in the lunch hall are drinking the same drinks and they can see that this is the expectation of everybody.
