1	 To increase the proportion of pupils achieving age appropriate standards in reading (in each cohort) through the rigorous implementation and cohesion of whole school agreed practice. (Ofsted action point).
2	 Middle Leaders to monitor the consistent implementation of Rosenshine's Principles in their subject, in order to promote pupils' memory and retention skills.
3	 Middle Leaders to use monitoring evidence to confidently and accurately articulate attainment, progress and achievement
4	 Provide increased opportunities for pupils to develop their mathematical language and reasoning skills so they can confidently apply learning in a range of contexts
5	 To ensure the school meets (or exceeds) national attendance targets (96+%) so that good attendance supports excellent achievement
6	 To explicitly teach <u>Academic and Elaborative</u> word lists across all subjects so that pupils internalise the formal language conventions of the curriculum in their oracy and recorded work.
