

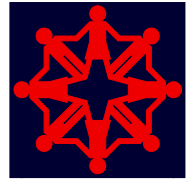

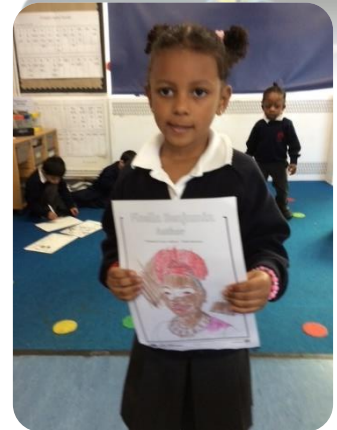

Dear diary,

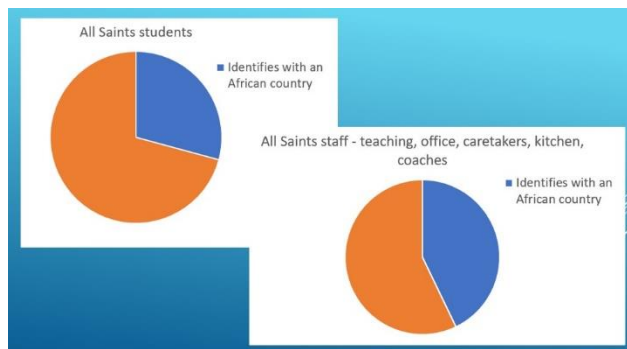

**Reporting absences**

**What YOU must do:**

Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence or email.

Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.

If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.

If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

**What WE will do:**

Check your child's attendance every day.

Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.

Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.

If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.

**If you are unsure, please contact a member of staff.**

**Smoking or Vaping**

Smoking or vaping is NOT permitted anywhere outside the school building. You must be at least 50 meters away from the school perimeter. Let us ensure that we are all promoting a healthy environment around the school and our pupils.



## Message from the Head Pupils regarding Zigzag lines

Dear Parents,

Please do not park on the zigzag line, we ignore this rule because it endangers infants up to seniors. Parking on the zigzag line is a fineable offence. You could pay up to £100 in compensation. You should not park on zigzag lines because you are/could be blocking pedestrians view of oncoming vehicles. There are a variety of accessible places to park so use it to your advantage instead of parking on the zigzag line.

Additional reasons:

- safety of public
- it is illegal
- (if wanted) your car can be towed
- you could even (possible) fall time
- it would obstruct oncoming drivers

these are the reasons you should not park on zigzag lines.
