Check your child's attendance every day.

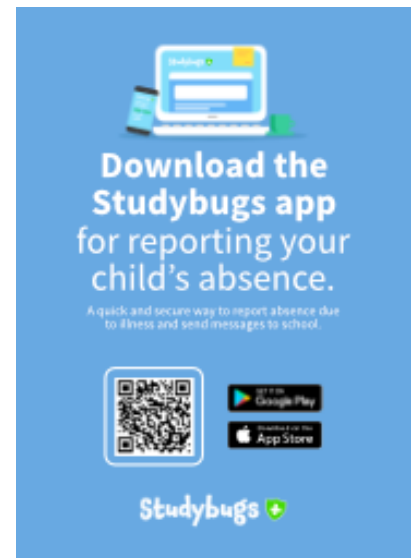
Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.
