

Simon of Cyrene - the man who carried Jesus' cross; Cyrene is in North Africa (Mark 15:21)



Queen of Sheba - visited King Solomon with gifts and wisdom; Sheba may have been in Ethiopia or Yemen.

Year 1 RE

In RE this term, Dolphin Class have been exploring the theme of Parables. We have learnt about two of Jesus' well-known stories – *The Lost Sheep and The Good Samaritan*. The children enjoyed acting out the story of the Good Samaritan, bringing the message of kindness and compassion to life through performances. They also sequenced the events of the Lost Sheep, showing great understanding of its meaning.

Through our discussions, we thought about why Jesus told stories and explored what the shepherd represents in the parable – helping us to understand how these stories teach us about love, care and forgiveness. The children shared thoughtful ideas and made wonderful connections between the parables and how we can show kindness in our everyday lives.



Year 4 – Black History

As part of our Black History Month celebrations, each class has been exploring both local and national figures who have inspired others and made a lasting impact on communities and the world. Year 4 have been learning about **Gloria Cameron**, who came to the UK as part of the **Windrush Generation**. She was a dedicated community worker, activist, playwright, and a passionate promoter of West Indian culture.

The children have created vibrant and informative collages showcasing what they've learned — and they look absolutely fantastic on display!
