### Black History Month UK 2025: Standing Firm in Your Power and Pride

This October, our school will proudly celebrate **Black History Month UK** with the inspiring theme "Standing Firm in Your Power and Pride." Throughout the month, children will explore the lives, stories, and achievements of Black Britons who have made significant contributions to our society, many of whom have lived and worked right here in Croydon.

Our school vision, inspired by *Micah 6:8* – "Act justly, love mercy, and walk humbly" – will guide us as we learn together. We want our pupils to see how these values are reflected in the lives of the artists, leaders, and changemakers we study, and how we too can live them out in our daily lives.

### What We'll Be Doing in School

**Studying Famous Artists** – Classes will look at the work of celebrated Black artists, both past and present. Children will create their own art inspired by their styles, celebrating identity, resilience, and community pride. **Exploring Black Britons in Croydon** – Pupils will research and learn about influential figures who have lived or worked in Croydon, discovering how their creativity and determination enriched the UK's cultural and social life.

- **Linking to Our School Vision** Through classroom reflections and assemblies, children will connect the stories they learn with our vision: to act justly by recognising fairness and equality, to love mercy by showing compassion and understanding, and to walk humbly by valuing the contributions of others.
- **Creative Projects** From posters and poetry to drama and music, children will share their learning and celebrate the powerful message of standing firm with pride.

### **Year 4 Science**

Year 4 explored the different parts of the digestive system and its functions, using a model. They discussed how well the equipment represented each part of the digestive system.

We needed to add water to act as saliva and break down the food.

We used the potato masher to break down the food, which represented our teeth.



My hand was like a tongue massaging the food through the funnel into the pipe. It represented the oesophagus.



The food mixed with water was poured into a freezer bag. It represented our stomach.







We added juice to represent stomach acid. This represents the food breaking down some more before descending into the small intestine.



Nutrients are absorbed through the intestine wall into the bloodstream to be transported around the body. We noticed that the liquid came through the material, but this doesn't actually happen during this part of digestion.



Finally, we passed the mixture through to the large intestine and we squeezed it out to reveal the waste that excretes from the anus. The scientific word from this waste is called 'faeces'.



### **Harvest Service**



This week the children went to All Saints Church for a very interactive Harvest Service. Each class contributed to the service, with year groups telling us what it means to share food with friends and family, what food they love, how we can waste less and share more. It was a wonderful time to come together and give thanks. We would like to thank you for your generosity, for which the Manna Society will be grateful.

Check your child's attendance every day.


Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.

### Message from the inspector for Croydon town centre team

We are aware of incidents involving school children at West Croydon Bus Station after school, particularly on Fridays. The police and outreach organisations such as Project 4 Youth Empowerment (P4YE) have observed large groups of school-aged children gathering at the bus station after school, where anti-social behaviour often occurs, sometimes involving fireworks. There will be increased police presence at the bus station in the coming weeks. We kindly ask schools, families and carers to encourage their children to head straight home after school to reduce the risk of further incidents. We want to ensure that our young people are safe.


