Anti-bullying Week

The Anti-Bullying Alliance (ABA) defines bullying as: The 'repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power." This four-part definition includes behaviour that is hurtful, intentional, repeated and involves a power imbalance, which can be physical, verbal or emotional.

Hurtful - The behaviour causes pain or distress, either physically, emotionally or both

Intentional – The person engaging in the behaviour does so deliberately and is aware it could cause harm

Repetitive – The behaviour occurs multiple times. A single incident can become bullying if it is immediately repeated or forwarded to a group, such as cyberbullying

Imbalance of Power – The person being bullied feels or appears to have less power in the situation. This can be done due to a physical advantage, a social group advantage, or because they are a minority. When someone tells a bully to stop and is ignored a power imbalance is also present.






Our Digital Leaders, in a special assembly for Anti-Bullying Week, conveyed to the whole school that the key message for Anti-Bullying Week 2025 is Power for Good, urging everyone to use their power to stop bullying and create a kinder, safer environment. This includes both young people and adults using their influence to speak out, offer support and promote kindness, whether in person or online. In worship the ABA definition of bullying was shared with the whole school. The school had various activities throughout the week, such as wearing odd socks, to celebrate our differences, anti-bullying pledges, watching themed films, and writing poems about overcoming challenges. We reinforced the importance of speaking up and reaching out for help, using resources like the Anti-Bullying Alliance's 'Power for Good' campaign, which encourages pupils to use their influence to stop bullying.

What is Neurodiversity? - led by The Autistic Girls Network

On Monday we had an assembly, which pupils accessed in their classes online. The speaker covered the following main topics in a very child-friendly way: neurodiversity? Neurodivergent strengths; A neurodivergent way of experiencing the world; How neurodivergent friends might communicate differently and how you can all compromise; Some things your neurodivergent friends might find difficult and how you can help.

It was a very informative assembly and our children asked some great questions which helped them to understand more and change any misconceptions they may have had. This tied in very well with our other assemblies in the week on Anti-Bullying and Acts of Kindness too.




Friday 21st November
