



Science Week in Year 4

This week, our school has been buzzing with curiosity and excitement as we celebrated Science Week! Across all year groups, the children embraced their inner scientists by asking thoughtful questions about the world around them. Using their class Science Investigation Tables, pupils explored their ideas through hands-on experiments and observations. It was wonderful to see such enthusiasm as they worked collaboratively, developing their scientific thinking and problem-solving skills.

In Year 4, children investigated the changing states of matter through a fun and engaging activity – melting chocolate in their hands! They observed how the solid chocolate slowly changed into a liquid as it warmed up, discussing how heat from their bodies caused this transformation. The children asked thoughtful questions, made predictions, and linked their observations to their learning about solids, liquids and temperature.

Science Week has reminded us that great learning begins with a question – and our children certainly had plenty of them!



Science Week in Reception



Reception Class have been busy exploring during Science Week! The children planted seeds as part of their experiment and have been carefully nurturing them, eagerly watching their cress grow day by day.

They also investigated a fun chemical reaction using baking powder, food colouring, water and a splash of vinegar.

Our young scientists have been fascinated by their experiments and are excited to see how their cress continues to develop!

To finish the week, year 5 became engineers themselves, designing and testing their own flight machines, including paper aeroplanes, helicopters and gliders. They enthusiastically challenged one another to see whose design could stay in the air the longest and travel the furthest.
